Services to Youth: Children will learn horse care and maintenance, safety around horses, grooming, groundwork (activities that build a solid relationship between horse and human) and riding skills (if desired). In the process of learning these skills and activities, children will work with an NSCA Certified Personal Trainer, a Licensed MSW, an Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Specialist, and a PATH Intl. Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor. In addition, children will benefit from the skills mentioned above in the relationship description.

Program Description: Horses 4 Health is a multi-faceted program that supports children physically, emotionally, behaviorally, and relationally. We operate after school and summer camp programs. The 4 components of the programs include the following. Rebounding/aerobic exercise on a mini-trampoline. Research shows this is the best exercise as it works every cell in the body against gravity with no impact. Resistance (developing strength through calisthenics, no added weight). Relationship between human and horse, students will learn and experience empathy, communication, both verbal and nonverbal, safety, boundaries, trust, patience, teamwork, resilience, confidence, and self-esteem. Lastly, riding, which is not mandatory and must have medical permission to participate.
