Purpose ~

Appropriate funds received from the New York State Office of Mental Health and authorize the County Executive to enter into contracts to develop a Recovery Center in Onondaga County.

Funding Information ~

The State Office of Mental Health awarded the Department of Mental Health \$250,000 in County fiscal year 2012. There is no local dollar cost.

Agency - Program

The Onondaga County Department of Mental Health was notified of this award to develop a recovery center on December 30, 2011 for the County Fiscal Year that began January 1, 2012.

A recovery center is not a physical place - it is a vehicle to provide access to a range of resources within the community that will enhance people's recovery from serious mental illnesses. The recovery center will serve as a clearing house for information regarding the range of available resources and as a support to help individuals connect to these resources, and will function as a hub providing individualized support for each person's recovery goals. Individuals will be assisted in their efforts to find jobs, connect to social networks, mental health and other services, or other resources that can help them achieve their recovery goals.

A core component of the recovery center model is that it be developed as a peer run service, using the skills and knowledge of people who have themselves recovered from mental illness. The Department will issue a Request for Proposals to contract with a not for profit organization that will work with an advisory board made up of representatives from the peer community, and that will serve as the fiduciary organization as it mentors the recovery center to establish itself as an independent 501(c)3 not for profit organization.
