AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO A LEASE AGREEMENT

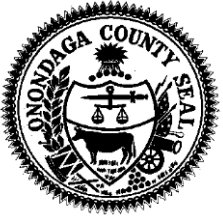

WHEREAS, the United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) and Onondaga County Sheriff's Office desire to engage in a joint cooperative law enforcement effort, referred to as the Central New York Contraband Interdiction Team (CNYCIT), for the purpose of facilitating cooperation and coordination with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies to assist in investigative and prosecutorial efforts concerning criminal offenses involving the trafficking of controlled substances and money laundering; and

WHEREAS, in exchange for the services to be provided by the Sheriff's Office to the CNYCIT, USPIS has agreed to reimburse certain Sheriff's Office overtime expenses and provide a monthly vehicle stipend; and

DEPARTMENT PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION SHEET

PURPOSE:

Authorize the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) to enter into an agreement with the United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) with respect to an intergovernmental agreement for the joint cooperative law enforcement effort, hereinafter referred to as the Central New York Contraband Interdiction Team (CNYCIT).

OBJECTIVE/ WORK PLAN:

The United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) and Onondaga County Sheriff's Office desire to engage in a joint cooperative law enforcement effort, referred to as the Central New York Contraband Interdiction Team (CNYCIT), for the purpose of facilitating cooperation and coordination with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies to assist in investigative and prosecutorial efforts concerning criminal offenses involving the trafficking of controlled substances and money laundering. This joint law enforcement operation will focus on illegal drug trafficking within and around Onondaga County, to include the seizure of illegal drugs, proceeds from drug trafficking and recovery of evidence relative to criminal activity. The Onondaga County Sheriff's Office will agree to participate in the CNYCIT and the USPIS will agree to pay reimbursed overtime as well as a vehicle stipend for the use of an Onondaga County vehicle.

The use of the US Postal Service has become a significant trafficking tactic utilized by drug traffickers bringing illegal drugs into this community. This partnership will be directed at disrupting the flow of illegal drugs into our community and intercepting and seizing proceeds of these crimes. This partnership is in the best interest of Onondaga County to establish such collaborative law enforcement partnership with USPIS for purposes of public safety and protection.

FUNDING SOURCE:

Overtime and vehicle stipend reimbursed through 525260-Public Safety Other Govt based on expenses.

BUDGET:

The budget is an allowable \$19,841 per year in reimbursed overtime paid to Onondaga County and an \$850.00 monthly stipend paid for by USPIS for the use of providing an acceptable vehicle for the task force member to use in furtherance of their obligations to the task force. The stipend incorporates all additional costs for the vehicle to include routine maintenance and minor repairs of the vehicle.
