This story cannot be told without discussion of understaffing, a problem that has long been denied by this county's leadership.

I want to clarify that CSEA and our members have made every effort through every available channel to improve staffing levels. CSEA requested assistance within labor management meetings regularly. Additionally on February 11th of 2021 an email was sent to the Acting Personnel Commissioner advising that the county was engaged in wage theft and exploitative labor practices. Our representatives sent an open letter to Ryan McMahon and this legislature later that same month and spoke to several news outlets around that time. I am quoting from that letter when I state that he was told, "our members are being extorted for free labor in order to fill the gaps." In addition Mr. McMahon had the benefit of personally attending an end of the year presentation put on by a prior deputy commissioner in December 2018 where it was identified -that the investigative staff in child welfare were understaffed at 64 caseworkers. 81 investigative -caseworkers were recommended for the Department to be fully staffed. Late in 2021 there were only 28 caseworkers addressing new State Central Registry reports in the department. The pleas for proper staffing appeared to be ignored completely.

There continues to be an impossible amount of tasks, thereby forcing employees to choose to face scrutiny, work for free or a combination of the two. In addition to this being a horrendous employment practice that is undoubtedly a large factor in the

staffing crisis, it places this community's most vulnerable children unnecessarily at risk.

I say all of this so you have a clear picture of events. As I stand before you today, I myself am uncertain as to how to advise or request that you vote. I am conflicted, as is much of our membership affected by this. Many of us would like to finally receive a fraction of the wages they earned and deserve, but we also know that this settlement doesn't pay nearly all of them for anywhere close to the amount of hours they actually worked. CSEA is prepared to accept the outcome of your vote this evening, but even if it is approved, we hope it will serve as the opening to a greater conversation and ultimately definitive action to address the culture of fear, understaffing and other problems that have forced this department into dysfunction despite the heroic efforts of the workers to keep it running. We stand ready to work with the County to improve the conditions, thereby protecting our members and the precious children and other members of the community we serve. Thank you.

The newspaper has called this a 'labor dispute' and I wish to be very clear that it is not. This is a violation of federal employment law that included the alteration of time documents and harassment of workers to require unpaid work with the blessing of the County Executive and the county's HR department.

The sum of the settlement that you will vote on today doesn't scratch the surface of paying the employees for the time they actually worked. The USDOL investigation substantiated that employees were not paid in accordance with FLSA laws for at least a two-year period of time for hours worked past -40 hours on a weekly basis. It does not address the breach of the contracted agreement to pay for hours between the 35-40 hour mark on a weekly basis. This settlement leaves a number of employees who will remain uncompensated for their work to the great benefit of the county. It also ~~excludes~~ omits a substantial number of supervisors that were excluded under the technicalities of FLSA laws, but I know these workers personally and they've told me their stories of what it has taken to keep the department functioning, especially when at times the department has been staffed at under half of all available positions. The \$900,000 settlement doesn't come close to compensating the staff who have continued to take on the burden of running the department by putting in far more hours than they should without being compensated for it.

BOND RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING VARIOUS BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AT A MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$1,300,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,300,000 BONDS OF SAID COUNTY TO PAY COSTS THEREOF

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Various bridge improvement projects, including retaining walls and approaches thereto, as well as incidental costs, are hereby authorized in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,300,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$1,300,000 bonds of said County, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is twenty years pursuant to subdivision 10 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not available from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer of such County. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. The County Executive is authorized to enter into contracts to implement the intent of this resolution. In the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are available at the end of the fiscal year, and if the Chief Fiscal Officer of Onondaga County deems it fiscally advantageous to use surplus funds rather than borrowing, all or a portion of the cost of the improvements authorized herein shall be paid using such surplus funds. Further, in the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are so utilized, then the authorization to issue bonds provided within this resolution is hereby rescinded accordingly, reduced by the amount of funds utilized.

Section 9. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 10. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the Syracuse Post Standard, the official newspaper of said County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is fifteen years pursuant to subdivision 20(c) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not available from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer of such County. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. The County Executive is authorized to enter into contracts to implement the intent of this resolution. In the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are available at the end of the fiscal year, and if the Chief Fiscal Officer of Onondaga County deems it fiscally advantageous to use surplus funds rather than borrowing, all or a portion of the cost of the improvements authorized herein shall be paid using such surplus funds. Further, in the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are so utilized, then the authorization to issue bonds provided within this resolution is hereby rescinded accordingly, reduced by the amount of funds utilized.

Section 9. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 10. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the Syracuse Post Standard, the official newspaper of said County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
