RESOLUTION NO. 75

ADOPTING A RETROACTIVE EARNINGS ADJUSTMENT FOR MANAGEMENT AND
CONFIDENTIAL EMPLOYEES FOR THE 2020 PAYROLL CYCLE

WHEREAS, collective negotiations have been conducted between the County of Onondaga and various bargaining units which included a one-percent (1%) off-schedule, non-compounding pay adjustment on base earnings for the 2020 salary cycle in order to offset a zero-percent (0%) salary schedule increase for the same period in the negotiated collective bargaining agreements; and,

WHEREAS, a Memorandum of Agreement has been executed between the County of Onondaga and the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc., Local 1000 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Onondaga County Local #834, Units 7800-00,01,02,03,04,06,07,08; providing for a one-percent (1%) off-schedule, non-compounding adjustment on base earnings for the 2020 salary cycle in order to offset a zero-percent (0%) salary schedule increase during the 2020 contract year of the January 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020 collective bargaining agreement between the parties; and,

WHEREAS, certain bargaining units had collective bargaining agreements in place for 2020 that provided for wage increases greater than one-percent (1%); and,

WHEREAS, it is equitable to provide the same wage consideration to Management and Confidential employees, who are not elected officials, and who have not received a wage increase for the 2020 salary cycle; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that full-time and part-time Management and Confidential employees, except for elected officials, on the active payroll or an approved leave as of the date of this resolution, be provided a one-percent (1%) off-schedule, non-compounding pay adjustment on base earnings during the 2020 pay cycle; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that calculation of the aforementioned pay adjustment be made on earnings from Pay Period 1 of 2020 through, and including, Pay Period 26 of 2020; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that payments shall be made to Management and Confidential employees, except for elected officials, at such time and in such manner, as deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Personnel; and the Commissioner of Personnel is authorized to make any administrative corrections as may be reasonably necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

WHEREAS, the County Executive submitted a copy of the Report and his recommendations to the County Legislature by letter dated March 4, 2021; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that consistent with Civil Service Law Section 209, this Onondaga County Legislature hereby determines that a public hearing be held regarding the terms and conditions of employment for the bargaining unit represented by the DSBA; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that with respect to the terms and conditions of employment for calendar year 2019, a public hearing shall be held at the Legislative Chambers by the County Legislature, at the Court House, Syracuse, New York on July 15, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that consistent with Civil Service Law Section 209, Onondaga County and the DSBA, as the employee organization, shall be required to explain their respective positions with respect to the Report; and, be it further

NAMING THE VETERANS MEMORIAL CHAPEL LOCATED AT 4069 HOWLETT HILL RD,
SYRACUSE, IN HONOR OF GORDON “GORDIE” LANE, A LIFE LONG RESIDENT OF
ONONDAGA COUNTY, 20 YEAR RETIREE OF THE SYRACUSE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND
COMBAT VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS

WHEREAS, Gordon Lane, known to all affectionately as “Gordie” was a lifelong resident of the Syracuse area, who dedicated his lengthy and accomplished career to public service and enhancing the needs to the veteran community; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, was a retiree of the Syracuse Police Department, after 20 years of dedicated service; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, was also a proud combat veteran of the United States Marine Corps, who served in Vietnam; and was a member of the 1st Regiment Virginia Volunteers in Fort Shenandoah, Virginia for many years; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, was a founding member of the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA), Central New York Chapter 103, where he served as President (1987-88) and held a lifetime membership; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, dedicated his life to serving the veteran community and was a member of several committees, including: the Onondaga County Executive Veterans Advisory Board ,the Onondaga County Veterans Cemetery Sub-Committee, Congressman Katko’s Veteran Advisory Board and Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 103 Memorial Day Watchfire; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, was instrumental, along with other founding members of the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA), Central New York Chapter 103, in conceiving a memorial to honor those who served in the Korean War and the Vietnam War, through the dedication of the Korea-Vietnam Memorial (KVM) in downtown Syracuse in November 1984, which symbolically continues to honor veterans today; and

WHEREAS, Gordie Lane, holds many awards and honors for his leadership and veteran advocacy, including the Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal and the National Defense Service Medal; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Onondaga County Legislature to recognize the outstanding history of dedicated public service by Gordon Lane and to name the Veterans Memorial Chapel located at 4069 Howlett Hill Road, Syracuse New York as the “Gordie Lane Memorial Chapel”; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that, given the many years of dedicated public service by Gordon Lane, and his unerring dedication to serving the Syracuse area and his country; and in recognition of this outstanding career and commitment to public service and, in particular, the veteran community, this Onondaga County Legislature hereby names the Veterans Memorial Chapel located at 4069 Howlett Hill Road, Syracuse, New York, as the “Gordie Lane Memorial Chapel.”

RESOLUTION NO. 79

AUTHORIZING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO FILE THE 2021 ACTION PLAN FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT, HOME GRANT AND EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to states and units of general local government to finance Community Development Block Grant Programs; and

WHEREAS, under Title II of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. 12721 et seq.), the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to states and units of general local government which participate in the Community Development Block Grant Program to finance the Home Investment Partnership Grant (HOME) Program; and

WHEREAS, under Subtitle B of Title IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11371 et seq.), the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to urban counties participating in the Community Development Block Grant Program under the Emergency Solutions Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the County has executed cooperation agreements with all the Towns and Villages within the County, which agreements specify that the County, the Towns and Villages will cooperate in undertaking or assisting in undertaking the Community Development Block Grant Program and, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the Onondaga County Executive has appointed a Community Development Steering Committee to advise on the use of anticipated funds under such Community Development Block Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, such Community Development Steering Committee has solicited public input from all the cooperating Towns and Villages for the purpose of developing the Community Development Block Grant Program for Onondaga County; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires the submission of a single application, known as the Consolidated Plan, for the Community Development Block Grant, the Home Investment Partnership Grant, and the Emergency Solutions Grant; and

A LOCAL LAW ADOPTING A PILOT YOUTH DEER HUNTING PROGRAM

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY, NEW YORK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as “A Local Law Adopting a Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.”

SECTION 2. Purpose

The purpose of this Local Law is to be consistent with the provisions of Environmental Conservation Law section 11-0935, this Local Law is adopted to authorize the expansion of youth hunting and allow licensed hunters ages 12 or 13 to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun or muzzle-loading firearm when accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or mentor.

SECTION 3. Authority

This Local Law is adopted under the authority granted by:

1. Article IX of the New York State Constitution, § 2[c];
2. New York Municipal Home Rule Law, § 10; and
3. New York Environmental Conservation Law § 11-0935.

SECTION 4. Definitions

1. “Eligible area” means any county within the State of New York that has enacted a local law authorizing participation in a youth hunting pilot program, and has notified the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation of such participation.
2. “Hunting license holder” means a person who has successfully completed a hunter education/safety course, and currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
3. “Legal guardian” means a person legally responsible for a minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder.
4. “Mentor” means a person who (a) currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, (b) is twenty-one years of age or older, (c) has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder, and (d) has been designated in writing by a minor’s parent or legal guardian on a form prescribed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to serve as a mentor to said minor for purposes of the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.

5. "Minor" means a youth twelve or thirteen years of age who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm within an eligible area.
6. "Parent" means a person who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder, and is the parent of the minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.
7. "Physical control" means that the physical proximity of a minor to a parent, legal guardian or mentor and is such that the parent, legal guardian or mentor is (a) reasonably able to issue verbal directions and instructions, (b) maintain constant visual contact, and (c) otherwise able to provide guidance and supervision to the minor.

SECTION 5. Opt-In Authorization

The youth hunting opportunities authorized by Environmental Conservation Law section 11-0935 shall be applicable within the boundaries of the County of Onondaga upon the adoption of this Local Law by the Onondaga County Legislature for the County of Onondaga, State of New York, and (b) notice provided to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation of the adoption of this Local Law.

Onondaga County hereby elects to participate in a Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program to allow minors ages 12 or 13 to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun or muzzle-loading firearm when accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or mentor.

SECTION 6. Eligibility and Requirements

1. A minor aged 12 or 13 may hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm within the County of Onondaga when accompanied by, and is under the physical control of, a parent, legal guardian or mentor as those terms are defined by Section 4 of this Local Law.
2. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program in an eligible area must be in possession of a valid New York State hunting license and valid tags, as appropriate, while afield at all times. The accompanying parent, legal guardian or mentor must also be in possession of a valid New York State hunting license at all times when supervising a minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.
3. A minor and the accompanying parent, legal guardian or mentor must display either a minimum total of two hundred fifty square inches of solid fluorescent orange or pink or patterned fluorescent orange or pink consisting of no less than fifty percent fluorescent orange or pink material worn above the waist and visible from all directions, or a hat or cap with no less than fifty percent of the exterior consisting of solid fluorescent orange or pink material and visible from all directions.
4. A minor aged 12 or 13 participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must remain at ground level at all times when hunting deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm.
5. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must remain within the physical proximity of a parent, legal guardian or mentor which means they must be capable of receiving verbal directions and instructions, and be in constant visual contact with the supervising parent, legal guardian or mentor at all times.

6. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must abide by all other federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations applicable to hunting including, but not limited to, manner of take, bag limits, hunting hours, geographical or general implement restrictions, hunting seasons, tagging, transporting and reporting requirements.

SECTION 7. Filing

In accordance with ECL § 11-0935.2, a copy of this Local Law shall be filed with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. And in accordance with Municipal Home Rule § 27, a copy shall be filed with the New York State Department of State.

SECTION 8. Severability

Should any provision of this Local Law be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Local Law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so determined to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 9. Repeal

All Ordinances, Local Laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. Effective Date

This Local Law shall be effective upon its filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
