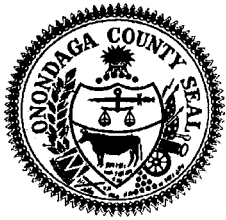
WHEREAS, as part of New York State's Highway Safety Program, the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee has made funds available to local partners to deliver quality traffic safety projects, services, and the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office has been selected to coordinate the local efforts for such projects, covering the period of October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, such funds will pay for a full-time coordinator and educator and all other administrative costs associated with the program and it is necessary to amend the budget to accept such funds; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute agreements and such other documents as may be reasonably necessary to implement this resolution.

ONONDAGA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION SHEET

PURPOSE:

Amend the 2017 Onondaga County Budget to accept \$115,500 in State of New York Governor's Traffic Safety Committee funds to participate in the 2017 New York State's Highway Safety Program and authorize the County Executive to enter into contracts to implement this program.

OBJECTIVE/ WORK PLAN:

In 1966, an act of Congress created the National Highway Safety Program. It provided that "each State shall have a highway safety program...designed to reduce traffic accidents and deaths, injuries and property damage resulting there from." In New York, the State of New York Governor's Traffic Safety Committee coordinates statewide traffic safety activities. The State of New York Governor's Traffic Safety Committee allocates grant funds to local partners to deliver quality traffic safety projects, services, and information.

The Onondaga County Traffic Safety Advisory Board oversees the local Traffic Safety Awareness Program and identifies priority traffic safety issues, implements coordinated actions and programs to reduce the number and severity of vehicular crashes, and evaluates and communicates the results of these actions and programs. The board has determined that the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office is the local agency that can best coordinate these efforts.

FUNDING SOURCE:

The State of New York Governor's Traffic Safety Committee has made funding available to local partners to implement its Highway Safety Program as described above. As it was last year, the Sheriff's Office was awarded funds to coordinate local efforts.

BUDGET:

Administrative costs eligible for reimbursement include:

- A full-time coordinator who will ensure the frequency and continuity of programs, conduct evaluations, and produce a report of each event's results, which will be made public. They will also will maintain the current library of resources and provide access to these to local schools, community organizations, other law enforcement, and traffic safety partners.
- Commodities used for the program such as postage, printing, promotional items, and educational materials.
- Other costs such as travel expenses, consultants, training, IT services, etc.
