INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings of the Onondaga County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board's 2015 review for the addition of viable agricultural land to agricultural districts in Onondaga County. The Onondaga County Legislature formally designated by Resolution 71 on April 5, 2004 an annual 30-day period in January when landowners can request that their land be added to an agricultural district.

Viable agricultural land, as defined in NYS Agriculture and Markets Law, Article 25-AA, Section 301, sub.7, is "...land highly suitable for agricultural production and which will continue to be economically feasible for such use if real property taxes, farm use restrictions, and speculative activities are limited to levels approximating those in commercial agricultural areas not influenced by the proximity of non-agricultural development." The requested additions were, therefore, examined primarily for natural features, location relative to existing agricultural districts, the size and characteristics of onsite and adjacent agricultural operations, agricultural production opportunities, and nearby development trends.

LANDOWNER REQUESTS

Landowners have requested that the following parcels be added to agricultural districts within Onondaga County. (Note, this report does not include parcels requested for addition which have been found to be currently enrolled in a certified agricultural district.)

<u>CAMILLUS</u>: One parcel is being proposed for addition in the Town of Camillus, a 156-acre farmed parcel fronting on Warners Road. Per the applicant, the property contains rotational crop fields, with pumpkins, small grain crops and hay grown on site, as well as a hop yard for the production of hops. The applicant notes a farm brewery is being constructed on site and all hops grown will be used in the production of beer at the brewery.

<u>CLAY:</u> In the northern portion of the Town of Clay, two adjacent parcels are proposed for addition (041.-03-37.0 and 38.0) on the south side of Guy Young Road. The applicant notes the land is associated with the production of grass hay, alpaca fiber, eggs, honey and fruit (apples, cherries, plums and pears). A relatively large housing subdivision has been approved on the north side of Guy Young Road in recent years, and another associated subdivision is currently being considered on vacant, largely wooded lands surrounding these parcels being proposed for addition. Other than the subdivision to the north, surrounding land is primarily undeveloped land and low density housing. A farm parcel directly across Guy Young Road was added to Agricultural District 3 during the 2014 eight-year review process.

<u>LYSANDER:</u> Four properties are being proposed for addition in the Town of Lysander. All are located within the largely agricultural western portion of the town. The Reeves request includes two parcels (029.-02-03.0 and 027.-03-29.0) totaling approximately 9 acres of land, both of which are surrounded by existing enrolled properties. The proposed uses of the land include tillable ground, support land, woodlot and land for drainage. The Stirushnik lands proposed for inclusion are a 44 acre parcel (025.-01-11.0) and a nearby one acre parcel (025.-01-25.0), and are to contain ornamental and woody plants for propagation.

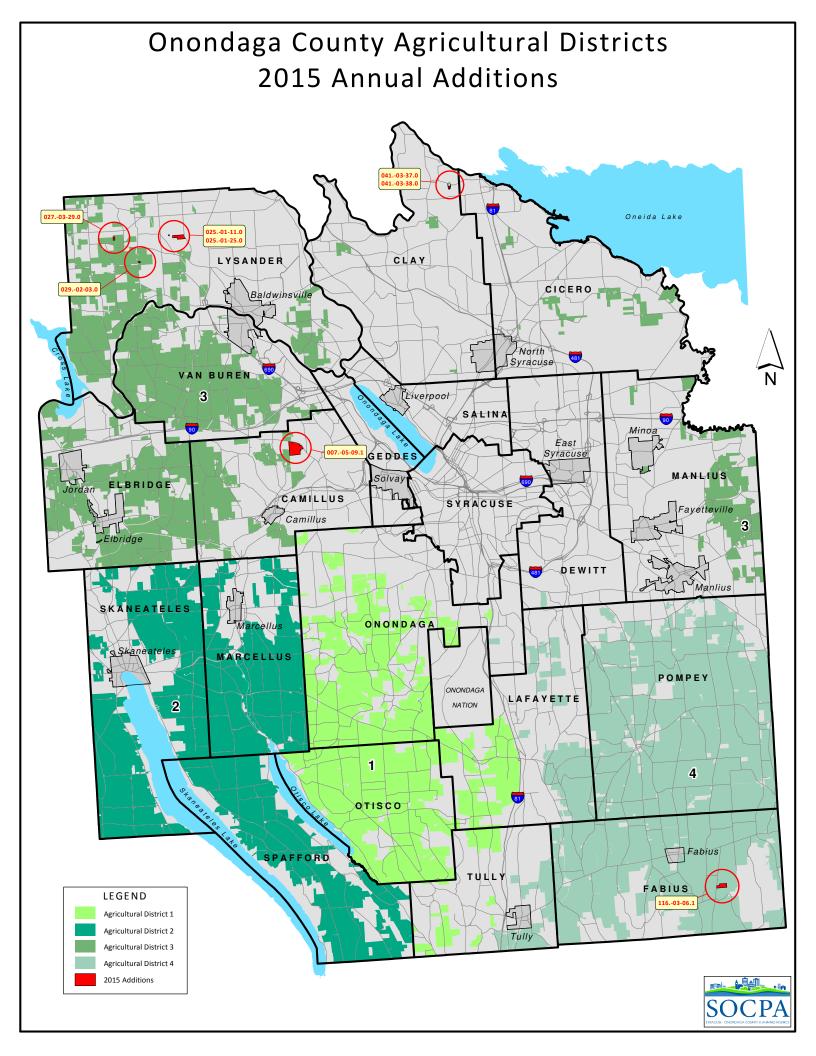

<u>FABIUS:</u> The proposed parcel (116.-03-06.1) is located on Vincent Corners Road in the Town of Fabius, southeast of the Village of Fabius. The parcel is vacant and contains sloped, wooded land, is approximately 2,000 feet from the Highland Forest County Park boundary. The parcel is entirely surrounded by parcels enrolled in Agricultural District 4. The applicant notes approximately 5 acres of land are used as pasture, and the owner plans to tap Maple trees (750-1000 taps) and grow garlic on the property.

According to the USDA NRCS Soil Survey Geographic (SSURGO) database, all of the properties proposed for addition consist largely of prime farmland soils.

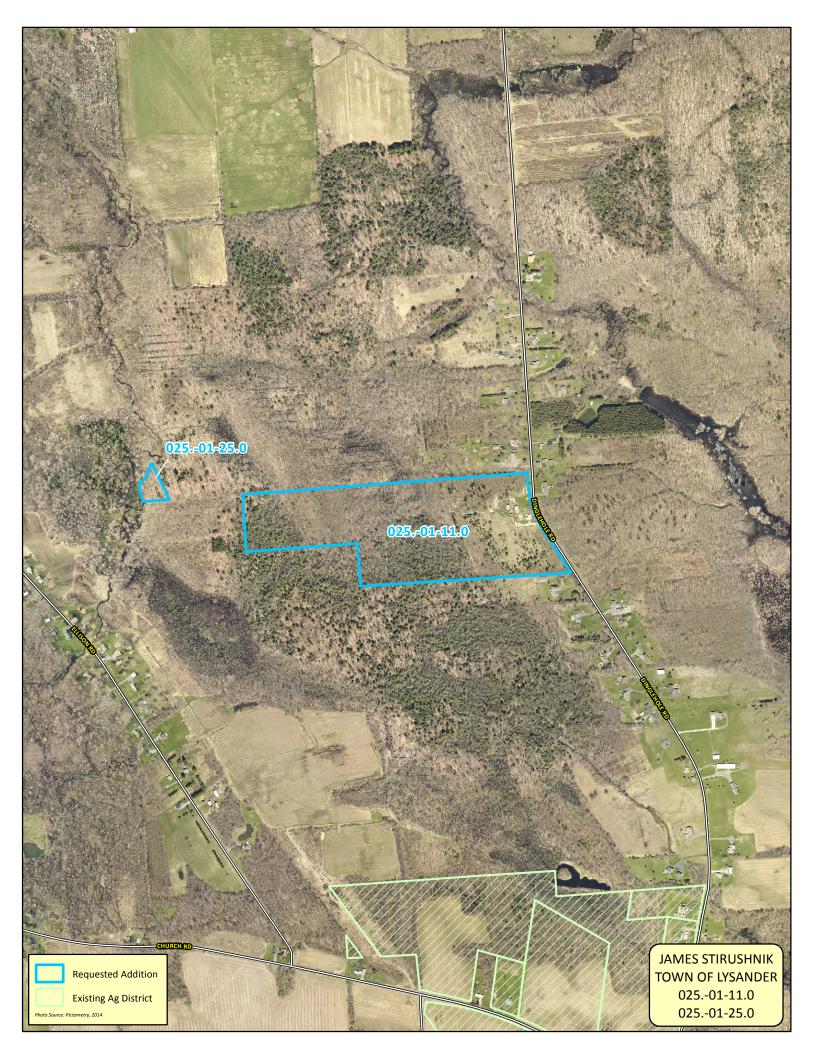

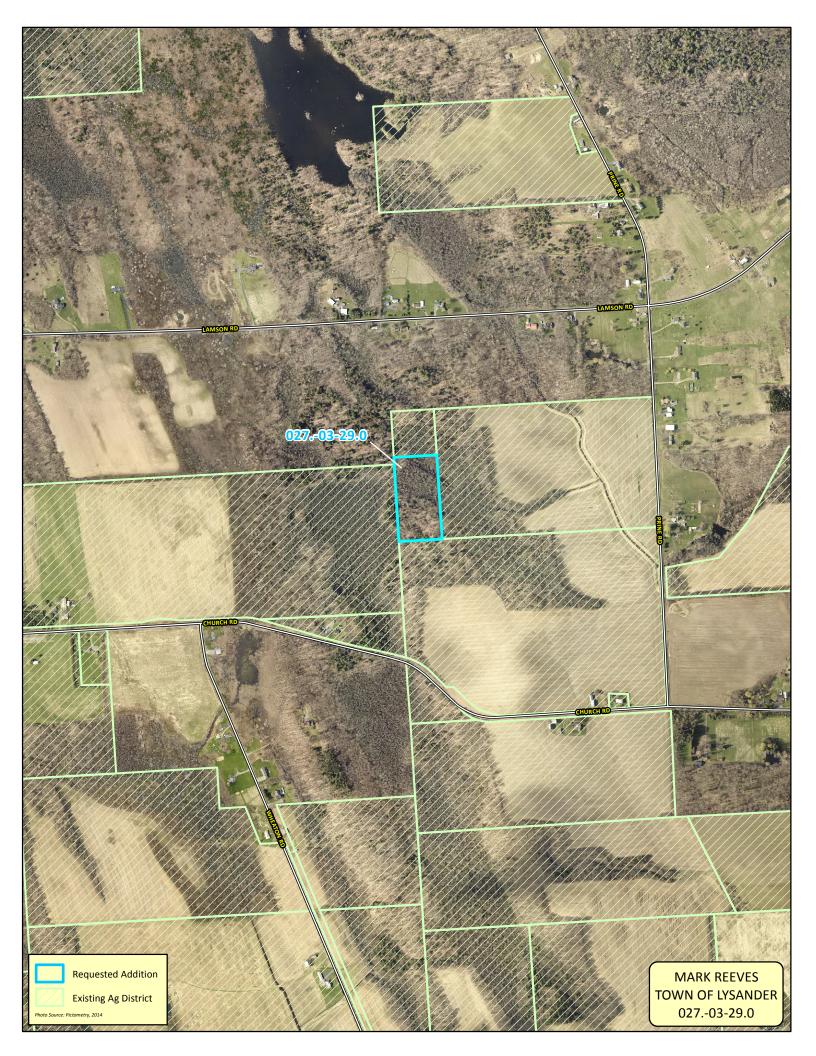
The following maps illustrate each proposed addition, as well as their context within Onondaga County.
